The Contracting Authority/Employer is the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure. The contract's scope includes the administrative, financial, safety and environmental monitoring and supervision of the Works Contract for the Removal of sunken German Fleet from the Danube River, to be implemented under the FIDIC Turn-Key contract conditions (Silver Book, FIDIC, Second Edition 2017) and Serbian Law regarding this Works. The scope of the Works Contract refers to removal of 21 sunken vessels from the WW2 from the Danube River near Prahovo (km 862-857), lying in the area containing a number of identified UXO. The project's purpose is to ensure fairway parameters for safe inland navigation, according to the international waterway Class VII requirements.

Financing - Finance Contract for Serbian IWW infrastructure between the Republic of Serbia and EIB ("Official Gazette of RS", No. 2/19), with approved co-financing from the WBIF in accordance with the Grant Agreement.

The following selection criteria will be applied to candidates. In the case of applications submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole if not specified otherwise. The selection criteria will not be applied to natural persons and single-member companies when they are subcontractors. Technical Ability

The candidate has provided services, during the reference period, of at least two (2) supervision contracts, each with a budget of at least 2 500 000 EUR in the field of Waterway Transport Infrastructure Works, executed under FIDIC (The International Federation of Consulting Engineers) conditions or similar contract conditions such as those used by the WB/EBRD/CEB/EIB and other IFIs, where the value of each supervised Works Contract was at least 15 000 000 Euro, which were completed.

The candidate has provided services, during the reference period, in at least one project related to supervision of works or works related to removal of sunken vessel(s).

The candidate has provided services, during the reference period, in at least one project related to supervision of works or works related to removal of UXOs.

This means that the service/works contract the candidate refers to could have been implemented at any moment during the reference period, meaning that the project referred to could have been started/completed at any time during the indicated period but it does not have to be started and completed during that period, nor implemented during the entire period. Tenderers are allowed to refer either to projects completed within the reference period (although started earlier) or to projects not yet completed. Completed projects will be considered in their whole if documentary evidence is provided (statement/certificate from the CA/Beneficiary, proof of final payment). For still on-going projects, only the part completed during the reference period, although started earlier, shall be considered and will have to be supported by documentary evidence (similarly to projects completed), detailing its value. If a project was implemented in a consortium, the percentage that the tenderer has completed must be stated in the evidence, together with a description of the services provided if the

selection criteria relating to the pertinence of the experience have been used. Documentary evidence is not required at the application stage but will be requested with the invitation to tender.

An economic operator may rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. In that case it must prove to the CA that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract through a commitment by those entities placing those resources at its disposal. Such entities, must comply with the same rules of eligibility as the economic operator relying on them and with the selection criteria for which the economic operator relies on them. The data for this third entity for the relevant selection criterion should be included in a separate document. Evidence will also have to be provided when requested by the CA.

For the technical and professional criteria, an economic operator may only rely on the capacities of other entities where the latter will perform the tasks for which these capacities are required.
